DISCIPLE SHIP IS KEY

Our sending church sent us out with a heart for discipleship. If a committed <u>soul winner</u> wins 50 people to the Lord every year (how many of our most faithful church members do this?), at the end of 20 years, he will have won 1,000 people. However, if a <u>discipler</u> wins ONE person to the Lord each year and accomplishes his goal to establish that disciple in the Word of God, the local church, and the ministry, the disciple learns to win someone and continue this cycle. At the end of 20 years, over 500,000 people will have been saved and established in the ministry.

At the age of 12, I had a friend that lived down the street named Tania. I shared the gospel with her and she agreed that she needed a personal relationship with Christ. I lacked the confidence to pray with her so I took her to my Dad. When he was sure she understood, the three of us prayed together. Her parents and especially her grandparents were very upset over the non-Catholic "influence" I was having on their daughter and granddaughter, and we were allowed to spend less and less time together.

Over the past ten or soyears, we have only spoken a few times but I have continued to have a burden for her. Since my return to Portugal, I have been able to renew that friendship and have prayed for an opportunity to talk with her about whether or not that decision was real. The topic came up easily in conversation and she gave a very clear testimony of salvation! I was overjoyed. She said over the

past ten years she has read over half of the Bible but, of course, has difficulty understanding much of it. She asked if we could meet for a weekly Bible study. Since we started, she has not



missed a week and has started attending our church with her four year old daughter, Luana. We are so excited to see what God will do in her life as she grows in Him.
