Our next challenge is to be able to still reach out to these kids during the year. We are hoping if we provide something specifically for their age group during the week, they will be allowed to attend. It is our desire to teach them systematically, not just provide a pizza/games/lesson youth activity. We are discussing how we might be able to implement a middle-school Bible club.
